#### **ENDNOTES**

The \$100,000 statutory maximum civil monetary penalty under the National Marine Sanctuaries Act (NMSA), 16 U.S.C. § 1437(d)(1), has been adjusted for inflation pursuant to the Federal Civil Penalties Inflation Adjustment Act of 1990 (Pub.L.No. 101-410), as amended by the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996 (Pub.L.No. 104-134), which requires each agency to issue regulations to adjust all civil monetary penalties established by law and assessed or enforced by the agency. As of December 14, 2004 the statutory maximum civil monetary penalty is \$130,000.
